Excavation Permit Checklist

City of Willard, Missouri

The following information is necessary to complete the Excavation Permit for the City of Willard. The excavation proposal shall be submitted at the time of the request for approval of the subdivision plat, or request for a zoning certificate, whichever first occurs or applies.

An original copy of an Excavation Bond in an amount comparable to the cost of the project is required as is proof, of insurance against the possibility or eventuality of destruction, harm, physical injury or other catastrophe caused or threatened to be caused by the excavation. For excavation within any fight-of-way, the applicant shall deposit with the City Clerk, an amount determined by the City to be not less than \$1,000 cash, as surety for performance.

If blasting is applicable to the excavation, please follow the guidelines on the Blasting Information Checklist.

Blasting Information Checklist

City of Willard, Missouri

- Time. Surface blasting operations shall be conducted during daylight hours, unless otherwise approved.
- 2. **Personnel.** Explosive materials shall not be utilized by inexperienced persons who are unfamiliar with the hazards involved or who have not obtained all of the required permits.
- Loading and firing. Loading and firing shall be performed by a person to whom the required permits have been issued.
- 4. Other persons. Trainees, helpers and other *persons* not holding the required permits shall work under the direct supervision of the *person* to whom the required permits have been issued.
- 5. Substance abuse. Explosive materials shall not be handled by a person under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- 6. Sources of ignition. Smoking shall not be permitted within 50 feet (15240 mm) of any location where explosives are being handled or utilized, and any person located with 50 feet (15240 mm) of said location shall not carry any matched, open light or other type of fire or flame, except suitable devices for lighting safety fuses.
- Notice. The blaster shall notify the appropriate representatives of the utilities at least 24 hours in advance of the blasting operation whenever blasting is conducted in the vicinity of utility lines or rights of way. The notification shall specify the location and intended time of such blasting and shall be first by verbal notice and then confirmed with a written notice. The 24-hour advance time limit shall not apply when approved to an emergency condition.
- 8. **Responsibility.** Blasting shall not be conducted until the blaster in charge has confirmed that all surplus *explosive materials* are in a safe place, all *persons* and equipment, including vehicles, are at a safe distance under sufficient cover and adequate warning signal has been given.
- 9. Precautions. Precautions shall be taken to prevent accidental discharge of electric detonators from currents induced by radar and radio transmitters, lighting, adjacent power lines, dust and snow storms or other sources of extraneous electricity and these precautions shall include the following:
 - a. The posting of signs warning that mobile transmitters shall be prohibited on all roads located within 350 feet (107 m) of blasting operations.
 - b. Observance of accepted blasting practice with regard to blasting in the vicinity of radio transmitters or power lines.
 - c. Both surface and underground use and all handling of explosive materials shall be discontinued during the approach and progress of an electrical storm, and all personnel shall be moved to a safe location.
- 10. Congested areas. Where blasting is conducted in a congested area or in close proximity to a structure, railway or highway, or any other installation that will be affected, special precautions shall be taken to prevent damage and minimize ground vibrations and air blast effects. Blasting mats or other protective devices shall also be utilized to prevent fragments from being thrown.

11.	Misfires. Explosive materials recovered from blasting misfires shall be stored in a separate magazine until disposal instructions have been received from the manufacturer and, upon receipt of said instructions and approval, such explosive materials shall then be disposed of in the manner specified. Detonators recovered from blasting misfires shall not be re-used.					
12.	Type. No excavation shall be done by uncovered or uncontained trench blasting.					
13.	Location. No blasting or discharge of any explosive material shall be done within 300 feet of any structure, building, residentially zoned property, or public improvement, including underground structures, public or private, unless the person or persons causing the excavation shall have complied with all other provisions of Chapter 600 of the William Complete Cook.					
14.	Liability. Nothing contained herein shall excluse at presponsibility or liability should they cause damage as a business, or corporation whether public or private, even as described herein.	result of their excavation to any person,				
15.	Inspection. The City may make an inspection of the site in order to certify compliance with the above provisions.					
16.	16. Pre-blast inspection and report. The inspection and reports shall be performed and prepared by an engineer registered in the state of Missouri. This needs to be on file with the City of Willard when applying for the Excavation/Blasting Permit.
