SEWER CONNECTION FEE:

WHO GETS CHARGED & WHY



Every year the City of Willard is required by the State of Missouri to collect a small sewer connection fee that is submitted to the state and deposited into the "Natural Resources Protection Fund". This fund was created for the purpose of protecting the air, water and land resources of the state.

The fee is collected according to a formula outlined by the state of Missouri. The fee per customer depends on the number and size of connections of water service and the type of connection, commercial or residential.

The fee for Willard Sewer Customers:

\$0.70 Residential Customers

\$3.00 Commercial Customers—up to 1" water meter \$10.00 Commercial Customers—I" to 4" water meter

The City of Willard collects this fee and submits it to the state ONCE per year. For 2013, this fee has been added to your January 20th billing.

Item #10) Articles 4, 7, & 8

Persons with a direct or indirect sewer service connection to a public sewer system owned or operated by a city, public sewer district, public water district, or other publicly owned treatment works shall pay an annual fee per water service connection provided in this subsection. Customers served by multiple water service connections shall pay such fee for each water service connection, except that no single facility serviced by multiple connections shall pay more than a total of seven hundred dollars per year. The fees provided for in this subsection shall be collected by the agency billing such customer for sewer service and remitted to the department. The fees may be collected monthly, quarterly, or annually increments, and shall be remitted to the department no less frequently than annually.
